We help break the cycle of homelessness by offering services such as affordable housing, job training, addiction treatment and counseling, to the poor, the elderly and individuals with mental illness.

## Our Annual Impact

## History

SOME was founded in 1970 by an interfaith group of priests, ministers, and lay persons to help feed the city's destitute citizens. After several years, SOME's founders saw needs beyond what the small soup kitchen could provide and began delivering additional services to support and nourish the city's neediest residents. Today, SOME offers comprehensive programs that meet a full spectrum of needs while giving a sense of dignity to the poor and homeless of the District of Columbia.
